It was an honor and a valuable experience for our students to work with him on a piece that he composed. Working with a composer to perform a piece he wrote is a remarkable experience for any student because of the insight that is shared during the rehearsal process. I'm happy our students were given that opportunity.

The Wind Symphony's outstanding performance at the KMEA conference in February will be aired on Channel 13; we will let you know the dates for that programming through the weekly e-news.

We have a busy weekend coming up at the end of April and the first of May, especially for the seniors. Because Lafayette has planned our prom on Saturday, April 30, we were able to schedule all three of our bands to perform for the District Seven Festival at Scott County High School for Friday, April 29.
