We're really excited about the potential of iHigh and we're happy to be the first marching band to participate. Thanks to everyone who participated in the video crew. We always like to be on the cutting edge and this project is no exception!

Our first football game is approaching; I'm looking forward to the excitement that night always brings. We won't be in uniform that night, and we won't be performing the entire show, but I think the crowd will enjoy what we have to present and we always enjoy performing in the new stadium.

The safety tips that we stressed during Band Camp were apparently very well heeded. I'd like to remind everyone that eating and sleeping well and staying hydrated is just as important now that we're back in school. After-school rehearsals may not be as long as a day

at Band Camp, but rehearsing after a full day of classes is just as draining. Please remind your student to eat a good lunch every day and bring a light snack, if needed, to eat between the end of classes and the beginning of practice at 3:45.

We'll be performing at several football games in September; the game on Sept. 9 will be part of a weekend that also includes our first competition at Danville High School. You'll be receiving itineraries for both events in the coming weeks.

Listed here the initial meeting dates, times, and locations for the Lafayette High School committees. **Budget Committee – Wed., Sept. 14, 4 p.m., LHS Library/
Media Center**

Determine school instructional needs, evaluate past spending of funds, anticipate future needs, and make recommendations to the SBDM Council for budgeting of instructional funds. Discuss and prioritize school needs and report to the SBDM by November 2011.

Discuss departmental and technology needs and report to the SBDM by January 2012. Make recommendations for budgeting of instructional funds to SBDM by February 2012. Make recommendations for staffing needs and assignments to SBDM by March 2012.

**Career Cluster Committee – Tues.,
Aug. 30, at 3:45 p.m., LHS counseling
conference room**

Facilitate the introduction of career info to all students and coordinate the completion of the Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) by all LHS students.

Develop advisories and activities to bring career relevancy to students. Implement a day of career-related activities for freshmen in the spring.

the fall to expose students to various careers and opportunities. Monitor accessibility and completion of ILP for students in every grade level.

Curriculum Committee — Tues., Aug. 30, 3:45 p.m., LHS Room 235

Promote student achievement by reviewing current curriculum policies, gathering information, analyzing data and making recommendations related to curricular and instructional issues to the SBDM. Participate in the review of the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP). Oversee the completion of the arts and humanities program review and the practical living/career studies program review. Review proposed courses and make a recommendation regarding offerings for the master schedule for the 2012-13 school year.

Literacy Committee – Tues., Aug. 30, at 3:45 p.m., LHS Room 212

Develop a policy and plan for implementing a school-wide literacy program. Oversee the completion of the writing program review, develop a policy to monitor the school-wide writing review activities. Coordinate the writing review three times per year. Make recommendations to technology for use of tech tools to support literacy instruction and storage of student documents and work.

Parent and Community Involvement Committee – Tues., Aug. 30, 5 p.m., LHS Library/Media Center

Plan meaningful opportunities for parents and community members to be more involved in Lafayette High School events. Use parent survey results and PTSA feedback to develop a plan for improvement.

Plan accessible and meaningful activities and events to help parents

understand and participate in Individual Learning Plans (ILPs), learn to use Infinite Campus, and connect with staff during the school year.

Communicate ideas for LHS Open House events throughout the year, with special emphasis on engaging disenfranchised members of the LHS community. Develop a plan to promote the successes of LHS to our community.

Help plan and participate in events such as Back to School rallies, freshman orientation, open house, career day, Orchestra on the Lawn. Recommend ongoing improvements to the school website.

Recognition Committee — Tues., Aug. 30, 3:45 p.m., LHS room 269

Review survey results and develop a plan to improve the communication for all students and staff. Survey all students, staff, and parents during the school year. Use survey results to make recommendations to the SBDM for school improvements. Develop a plan for recognizing and communicating accomplishments of all students and staff throughout the school year (report to SBDM each month). Schedule and make recommendations for improvement to the fall and spring student recognition rallies.

Response to Intervention (RTI) Committee – Tues., Aug. 30, 3:45 p.m., LHS room 121

Develop a school-wide structure for assessing and improving the academic achievement of all students by clearly communicating the behavioral expectations of the students and staff. Describe the school-wide behavior program and make recommendations for improvement, specifically the use of the SAFE program. Gather

behavior and academic data and make recommendations for a plan to address students who are unsuccessful in these areas. Develop a plan for supporting/training staff in these areas to help all students reach success. Develop a plan to ensure all students understand how to be successful at school within the expectations of the school-wide behavior plan. Monitor and report on the plan throughout the year to the SBDM.

Technology Committee – Tues., Aug. 30, 3:45 p.m., LHS room 130

Determine school technology needs and make recommendations to the council on budgetary needs, professional development needs, and instructional plans for the school and staff. Make a recommendation for the budgeting of technology funds to the budget committee by November.

Information to Come

As the calendar grows closer to the beginning of competition season (Danville High School, on Sept. 10), you will receive itineraries and other information that you will need to make arrangements to travel to competitions or pick up students when they arrive at Lafayette after out-of-town travels. Watch your email for this information.

The Band will stay at the Holiday Inn University Plaza in Bowling Green. If you would like to stay in the same hotel, we have heard that rooms are available, but reservations must be made early. Please do not ask to stay on the same floor as the Band. Those rooms are reserved for students, staff and chaperones. There are also rooms available at other hotels in Bowling Green. Taking Your Student Home With You? PLEASE READ THIS!

When the competition season starts, you may find that you would like to take your student home instead of having him or her return to Lafayette. This is perfectly acceptable, but please follow these procedures to assure that chaperones are able to keep track of 200 students (give or take a few).

- Speak with Mr. Smith or Dr. Magee, face-to-face, and tell them of your intention. THIS IS REQUIRED.
- Sending the information, early in the week, is a good idea, but not required.
- If you are planning to take another student, not your own, with you, that information must come from the other student's parent in writing.
- Make certain that arrangements have been made for loading your student's instrument AND UNLOADING UPON RETURN TO LAFAYETTE.
- Be prepared to show identification when you take your student.

Develop and communicate a plan for training the staff in administrative and classroom technology use. Oversee the inventory procedures of the school's technology resources. Work with the literacy committee members on a plan for the use of technology to support literacy instruction and storage of student documents and work. Report on the state of technology (equipment, training, use) by end of the school year.

Wellness Committee – Tues., Aug. 30, 7:15 a.m., LHS room 101

Develop a plan to address the well-being of all students, staff, and community of LHS. Monitor the implementation of the plan to address bullying and harassment through freshmen government classes. Develop a plan for improving student and staff health. Develop a plan for prevention of alcohol and illegal drug use by students. Develop and facilitate a presentation to classified and certified staff to emphasize a welcoming atmosphere at LHS, recognizing the wide diversity of our community.

Rules of Etiquette for Band Competition

As Lafayette Band "fans-in-the-stands," we are ambassadors for the Pride of the Bluegrass®, the Lafayette Band. Our actions in the stands are directly related to the hard work and PRIDE of each of our students marching on the field.

When attending performances and competitions as ambassadors of the Lafayette Band, we have an opportunity to set the standard for fan behavior, just as our students have worked to set the example for performance.

Being an ambassador of the Pride of the Bluegrass® includes consideration and respect for the hard work and performance of others. When attending a performance, let's keep a few key points in mind:

- Save conversations for the times between performances. Others want to hear the music.
- Being careful what you say about the performance of other bands while you are at a competition, can prevent hurting the feelings of other parents whose child has worked as hard as yours. Being appreciative of the performance of other bands will leave a lasting positive impression of the Lafayette Band.
- Always applaud a band's performance. The students work long and hard to perfect a performance and enjoy your appreciation of their efforts.
- When attending a performance outdoors, be prepared for inclement weather with a poncho or raincoat. Umbrellas block the view of those behind you and may even be dangerous to others in the close quarters of stadium seating.
- Our students thrive on our support and look to the stands for the waving Lafayette Flags. Distribution of flags to Lafayette fans will occur at contests just before Lafayette performs.
- Wait to raise Lafayette flags and cheer for Lafayette until the previous band has completely left the field.
- When the band is set to perform, refrain from yelling a name or cheering. Our students are in performance mode and are concentrating on delivering an excellent performance.
- After the performance begins, lower your flag so that everyone can see the show. When the performance ends, raise your flag until Lafayette leaves the field.
- After the Lafayette performance, flags will be collected for distribution at the next Lafayette Band performance.
- When photographing or video taping a performance, be mindful not to block the view of others. (Reminder, BOA does not permit video cameras.)
- Finally, and most important, attend as many performances as possible to support our students and to enjoy the show!
